People facing a serious, life-limiting illness deserve the choice to decline life-sustaining treatment. Completing a **Practitioner Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment (POLST)** form with a health care practitioner is the gold standard for patients to express these wishes. It is time for Illinois to align with national standards by passing \$B0109.

- Illinois is one of only two states that has a witness requirement for state-sanctioned POLST forms, making it a national outlier.
- In the past, Illinois has been at the forefront of amending statute with trailer bills to achieve full alignment with national standards it is time to do the same with POLST.
